“As he was setting out on a journey, a man ran up and knelt before him, and asked him, “Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?” Jesus said to him, “Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: ‘You shall not murder; You shall not commit adultery; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness; You shall not defraud; Honour your father and mother.’” He said to him, “Teacher, I have kept all these since my youth.” Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said, “You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.” When he heard this, he was shocked and went away grieving, for he had many possessions.” *Mark 10: 17-21*

I find myself being asked many questions about the faith, be it at Queen's Theological College or when socialising with friends and family. It interests me that a number are concerned about the quality of their discipleship. They can confess Christ as Lord but feel overwhelmed by what is being asked of them; how can one give all their money to the poor when they have children to feed or bills to pay? Mark's *'Rich young man'* episode is one that is often quoted by people when discussing this matter as there is, if we are to be honest, a degree to which we sympathise with him. He has kept the law, done what was commanded of him and now he has to give away all his fortune when he has his youth to enjoy it!

In my discussions on this text I have found that there is a subtlety that is important to note, the young man approaches Jesus, recognises his authority and asks what he must do to have eternal life having done all that God had asked of him. The gospel notes that Jesus first

reaction was to look on him with love. The man was loved by the Lord for acknowledging his authority and for keeping the covenant of his time, performed in faithfulness. To use St. Paul's language, one can say that the young man was justified by his faith in Jesus Christ, as he was looked on with love, yet he was specifically called to give up his wealth on earth to store them in heaven.

Ever since the time of Athanasius' biography of the hermit St. Anthony, who praised the ascetical life, it was understood that such austere lives were reserved for those for who were called. In many cases in Christian history, ascetics would be supported by local Christian families with food and companionship. There was recognition of a variety of callings and gifts within the disciples of Christ.

Yet the underlying truth of Jesus' teaching is relevant to us all. You are loved by Christ for your faithfulness but to edify that faith, make more time for God. The reason for the young man giving up such wealth would be to secure the attention and time necessary to follow Christ more closely.

Our faith justifies but we need to make more time for God and starting Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> January at 7.30pm there will be a number of Christians across the Parishes of St. Mark's, St. Margaret's, Porthill and Bradwell who will come together to study the faith as part of the one year Bishops Certificate. This is a fantastic opportunity to make more time for God and to learn about our faith. This will be our only faith building offering this year so it is certainly worth consideration. Fr. Terry, Fr. Chris Routledge and myself will lead the sessions and they promise to be fun and informal finishing at 9.00pm. We look forward to seeing as many of you as possible as we make more time for our God. Don't feel that you need to do the whole course if that is problematic, you could dip in and out of modules if you must.

The CA local representative tells us that last year the sponsored walk raised almost £51,000 and remains one of its most successful annual fundraising events for the charity

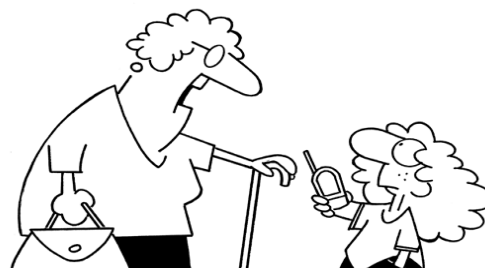
Concerning this year's walk to be held on Saturday, 8<sup>th</sup> April; donations and promises of financial support have already been made to cover all this year's expenses - so every penny collected in sponsorship will go directly helping others. The Tittesworth Reservoir authority is allowing walkers to park their vehicles for a payment of £2.50, regardless of how long they stay. (It would normally cost £4.70 to park for more than two hours).

Registration takes place from 9.15am onwards. The walk will commence at 10.00am and walkers should aim to complete the course by 1.00pm. There is a choice of two routes - a short 'easy' walk of approximately 2 miles or a longer walk of roughly 5 miles, both of which will be clearly signposted. As usual St. John Ambulance Brigade members will be on duty together with CA's own stewards and Easter eggs will be distributed to any who come in fancy dress or wear an Easter Bonnet.
