

I am here to be a stirrer!

Words of the Psalmist: Give ear, O Shepherd of Israel, you who lead Joseph like a flock!

You who are enthroned upon the cherubim, shine forth before Ephraim and Benjamin and Manasseh. Stir up your might, and come to save us! Restore us, O God; let your face shine, that we may be saved. (80:1-3)

Beloved,

This month, we complete the year of the church with the Kingdom season, ending with the feast of Christ the King, also known as Stir-up-Sunday, as the post communion prayer of the day refers.

When we think of 'stirring', apart from doing some cooking, (the tradition is to make your Christmas Pudding on stir-up-Sunday!) it possibly has a negative feel – someone is likely not behaving the best they can if they are stirring someone up.

However, as your priest, I believe I have the right to be a 'stirrer' and to 'stir you all up!'

At my ordination the bishop asked me: "Will you then, in the strength of the Holy Spirit, continually stir up the gift of God that is in you, to make Christ known among all whom you serve?" And I responded, "By the help of God, I will."

I believe it is my role to encourage you, to re-think the Good News, to re-think your faith, to re-think your life as a member of the Body of Christ, to re-think the gift of God that is in YOU; so as one year completes and another begins, it might be a good time to reflect and plan.

THANKYOU to each of you for continuing to be Christ's hands, feet and eyes in Basford and Wolstanton - Thankyou for getting to the end of another year of 'being the Church'.

But every so often it is good for us to take time to see how much we may have shut God out, or got too cosy and relaxed in the faith that we are told, yes will be JOY, but will not be easy.

Being stirred up is not a negative or an annoyance, but a JOY in thinking through where YOU are with GOD and where that relationship can be even BETTER!

This is not a great sermon about Sin or anything heavy, but a STIR for us to question where the regular and monotonous may have taken over in our original Damascus (our initial contact in the faith if you like!), where might we be a little LOST, and unfulfilled, and tired, and in need of being refreshed in the name of LOVE, and need to discover again that in Christ, we have been FOUND?

We are about to start a New Year! We need to be ready! We need to focus! We need to make YOU and CHRIST the priority! Tidy up, get the messy jobs out of the way, clear the desk & diary, get rid of the busyness, actively block in some December time to be still, plan a prayer timetable, meet your spiritual director, find something spiritual to read, get ready to stop yourself being caught up in all the nonsense of Christmas, get ready to FALL IN LOVE with Christ all over again!

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, YOU DON'T HAVE LONG, Advent begins on November 27th, and we must

only GET to the Mass-of-Christ, to Christmas, having LIVED Advent, so make it count

Stir up, O Lord, the wills of your faithful people; that they, plenteously bringing forth the fruit of good works, may by you be plenteously rewarded; through Jesus Christ our Lord.


