Giving Direct

Both PCCs are always thankful for the financial support from parishioners, whether it be through standing order, the envelope scheme or cash offering and where possible through the gift aid scheme. We would however encourage you to consider a relatively new scheme introduced by the Diocese called 'Giving Direct'. Through this scheme, your financial giving is made by direct debit directly to Lichfield Diocese, anonymously if preferred, and then sent as a lump sum to the church within 14 days. The scheme removes the gift-aid administrative burden for our finance team, but more importantly St Mark's and St Margaret's receive the gift aid monies alongside each donation rather than having to wait over 12 months under the current scheme, massively helping our cash flow. Even if you are not a gift-aider, please do consider the scheme as it ensures a regular income stream to the Church so that we can better budget and meet our expenditure commitments.
