Now in Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity. At that time she became ill and died. When they had washed her, they laid her in a room upstairs. Peter arrived and was taken there.

All the widows stood beside him, weeping and showing tunics and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was with them. Peter put all of them outside, and then he knelt down and prayed. He turned to the body and said, 'Tabitha, get up.' Then she opened her eyes, and seeing Peter, she sat up. He gave her his hand and helped her up. Then calling the saints and widows, he showed her to be alive. This became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Lord.

### St Margaret's Heritage Day:

#### Sustainability:

Last week, St Mark's PCC discussed sustainability particularly around the use of single use nonrecyclable cups that we currently use for tea and coffee after our services. With the lack of volunteers to help with tea and coffee (new volunteers always welcome!) washing of china mugs is not a practical solution that we can move to at the moment. Alternative single use cups are available that are sold as recyclable; however this is subject to the local councils recycling contract and unfortunately, Newcastle's current kerbside recycling does not accept these types of cups for recycling! We will continue to investigate other forms of cup, but in the meantime it is pointless moving to a more expensive cup that still can't be recycled locally. If it is your preference, parishioners are more than welcome to bring their own similar sized (7oz) cup which we will happily fill, alongside the current cups.
