
The Lion and The Dragon

I recently went to the theatre to see Jesus Christ Superstar, a fabulous musical from Andrew Lloyd Webber and Tim Rice. It was the first musical I ever went to see while at High School.

Like any of the different interpretations of the story of Jesus Christ from the Bible that have been produced over the years, it brings alive that most incredible of stories of His Great Passion.

Lyrics from the musical say: "Jesus Christ, Superstar, Do you think you're what they say you are?"

This is a question we must ponder at this time, and let us each pray that we have the same answer as that centurion who looked upon the lifeless body of a man and cried "*Truly this Man was the Son of God."* (Matthew 27:54, Mark 15:39, Luke 23:47).

This Lent and Passiontide, we are called to live out our own interpretation of those fascinating events of 2,000 years ago, as we recall the narrative and enter the deep mysteries of Truth. The most important time comes with Holy Week, and in fact the last 3 days, the Triduum – I hope you will join me in the Upper Room, in Gethsemane, at the Cross and by the Tomb.

The Liturgy of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter give us the chance for vigil and awe.

One of the most famous songs in the show goes: "I don't know how to love him. What to do, how to move him. I've been changed, yes really changed. In these past few days, when I've seen myself." I hope we can echo those words as we approach Easter — it isn't always easy, I don't think it's meant to be. We enter the mystery faith and look closely at where we are.

"Try not to get worried, try not to turn onto, Problems that upset you, Don't you know, Everything's alright, yes, everything's fine."

We bring to the Cross, our pain, our hurt, and all the bits where things and life is Not "Alright", But we let light in, curtain torn in two, dead are raised to life, we cry victory, Death is crushed to death, life is ours to live, and so we start once again.

May your journey to the cross and the empty tomb, this year, be Holy and life-changing.
