'The signs and the seasons will change' we read in the bible. They are certainly doing just that this week. Yesterday after seeing the bad weather forecast for the North of England, I telephoned my cousin in North Yorkshire to discover that they were fast indoors with 10 inches of snow outside and more to come!

The church's year is now nearing its close. Probably by the time this letter reaches you the feast of Christ the King will have passed with Advent Sunday heralding in the church's new year.

The season of Advent is a time of reflection for the Christian. The word Advent means 'Coming' So who is coming? Some will reply Father Christmas, presents, lighted trees, Crackers, Turkey and tinsel.

Now I'm not a Bah humbug or Scrooge but surely for the Christian Advent has to have a deeper meaning. As a child I well recall the weekly visit of the Vicar to the school I attended where he taught R.E. I remember the class having to learn and recite the words of the hymn 'Advent tells us Christ is

near...this hymn tells of the seasons of the Church's year. The hymn was written in 1888 by Katherine Hankey for the children of St Peter's Sunday School, in Eaton Square, London. the first verse begins...

Advent tells us Christ is near,

Christmas tells us Christ is here.

In Epiphany we trace

All the glories of his Grace....

In this way we children learned about the shepherds seeking the Christ Child and the Wise men journeying from afar searching for the one who is to be born King. During Advent we, like the shepherds and Wise Men of old, continue our Advent journey not on a donkey on a dusty road or a camel travelling through the desert sands. So how do we prepare to meet the newborn King.

Each year the church gives us a bit of breathing space in the season of Advent just as it does in the season of Lent to prepare ourselves in reflection and prayer to greet Emmanuel, God with us.

Just like Christ rising from the dead at Easter, Christ being born at Christmas is not
